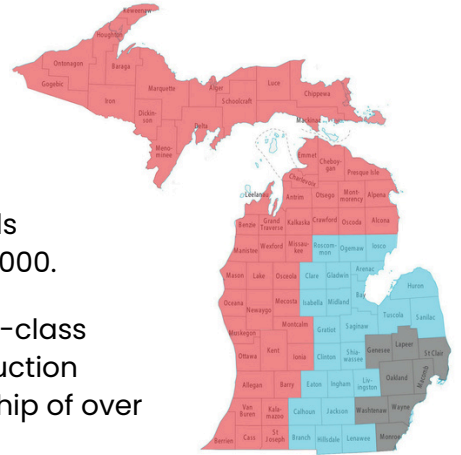

DEFEND THE INDUSTRY.

DEFEND is not merely a word; it encapsulates the **essence of our mission**. Our objective is to **defend and advance the merit shop philosophy** that champions **free enterprise** and **open competition**. We believe in a marketplace where everyone has a fair chance to succeed **based on their merit**, not affiliations or alliances.

What is 'Merit Shop'?

MERIT: A dedication to providing opportunities for all. Creating conditions for everyone to compete on a fair and level playing field. Every individual and organization has the opportunity to succeed based on merit.

MERIT SHOP companies compete and thrive based on the quality of their work, their team's proficiency and work ethic, and their innovative problem-solving skills. Their success is not linked to political connections or regulatory benefits but to the inherent value they bring to their customers.

The Issues Impacting ABC Members

1 Oppose Government-Mandated Project Labor Agreements (PLAs)

Why it matters.

PLAs are anti-competitive schemes that eliminate open, fair, and competitive bidding on public construction projects, **driving up costs by 12-20%**. They exclude merit shop contractors and their skilled local workforce, forcing nonunion contractors to pay double fringe benefits, use unfamiliar union hall workers, recognize unions without employee consent, and exclude their own DOL-registered apprentices.

ABC's stance.

ABC strongly **supports the 2011 Fair and Open Competition in Government Construction Act**, which **bans PLA mandates** and ensures equal opportunity and taxpayer value.

ABC opposes legislation, which would repeal this law, and aim to **preserve Michigan's Local Preemption Law**, which prevents local PLA mandates.

2 Protect Independent Contractors and Business Flexibility

Why it matters.

Independent contractors are vital to the construction industry's project-based workforce model. Preserving independent contracting supports small business growth, encourages workforce flexibility, and reduces unnecessary litigation and compliance risks.

ABC's stance.

ABC **opposes** any efforts to restrict or reclassify legitimate independent contractors, including legislation modeled after California's AB 5, which is modeled after the so-called "ABC Test."

Did you know?
Nearly **90%** of the United States construction workforce **did not** belong to a **union** in 2025.

3 Repeal Michigan's Prevailing Wage Law and Stop Expansion

Why it matters.

Michigan's prevailing wage law inflates taxpayer-funded construction costs by 10% or more. It applies union wage rates to all contractors, even though unions represent only about 20% of Michigan's workforce, and forces contractors to navigate over 350,000 wage classifications.

ABC's stance.

ABC opposes any effort to expand prevailing wage requirements to other publicly or semi-publicly-funded projects. Repealing this law would reduce costs for public projects and increase contractor participation and job opportunities.

4 Reform State Agency Enforcement and Permitting

Why it matters.

EGLE reclassifies developed sites as "wetlands," halting or preventing construction and delaying permits with slow responses, which increases project costs and timelines.

MIOSHA issues citations to subcontractors not involved in violations, sends delayed citations after providing verbal clearance, and often conflicts with other agencies like EGLE on safety practices.

ABC's stance.

ABC supports

- **Transparent, real-time enforcement**
- **Timely and consistent permitting**
- **Clear interagency coordination**

5 Defend Workforce Training Quality and Freedom

Why it matters.

Ensure that all qualified apprentices, regardless of their affiliations, have the opportunity to work on public projects. Apprenticeship training goes beyond Department of Labor (DOL)-registered programs—it includes other nationally-recognized training initiatives that provide equal value and opportunity.

ABC's stance.

Policymakers should support flexible, market-driven workforce development strategies that empower workers and employers to build skills and drive growth. ABC members use competency-based education to create a safe, skilled workforce while promoting inclusion and fairness.

ABC opposes changes to journeyman-to-apprentice ratios in trades like electrical and plumbing, as they weaken mentorship and hinder training for the next generation of workers.

Principles of the Merit Shop

The Associated Builders & Contractors, Inc., Western Michigan Chapter is the voice of the Merit Shop in the construction industry. We assume the responsibility of making that voice heard.

- We believe that the Merit Shop movement is a movement for the betterment of the individual, the industry, and the nation.
- We believe in the system of free enterprise and open competition.
- We believe that employees and employers should have the right to determine wages and working conditions, through either individual or collective bargaining, as they choose, within the boundaries of the law.
- We believe that the employer must have concern for the general welfare of the employee and that there must be fair compensation for work performed. By the same token, we believe that the employee has an obligation for satisfactory performance of assigned work.
- We support sound legislation in the areas of workers' compensation, safety, and unemployment compensation. We believe legislation that embraces fair play for both employer and employee is essential to the preservation of our free enterprise system. The law should protect the right of employees to work regardless of race, color, creed, age, sex, national origin, membership or non-membership in a labor organization, protected veteran status, qualified individuals with disabilities, or other protected class.
- We oppose violence, coercion, intimidation, and the denial of the rights of both employees and management.
- We believe that economy is incumbent upon all branches of government and that government should award contracts to the lowest responsible bidder only. We oppose any unjust pressure to violate these principles.
- We believe that work opportunities in this nation should be made available to all people regardless of race, color, creed, age, sex, national origin, membership or non-membership in a labor organization, protected veteran status, qualified individuals with disabilities, or other protected class, and we support programs toward this end.
- We believe that monopolies or any kind of price or wage fixing in either the public or private sector are detrimental to our system of free enterprise.
- We believe that the destiny of all Americans can best be served by cooperation and following the tenets of free enterprise and democratic government. We believe business leaders can best preserve these tenets by becoming active in politics and civic affairs.

Purposes and Objectives

The primary purpose and objective of this Chapter is to foster and perpetuate the principles of the Merit Shop Philosophy.

In addition, the Chapter shall have the following purposes and objectives:

- Encourage, develop, and protect the building and construction industries.
- Promote confidence and goodwill within the building and construction industries and between these industries and the general public.
- Promote and make available to membership the various programs organized by the National Association.
- Organize builders, contractors, trade contractors, supplies, and related groups and interests in order to encourage the free interchange of views and techniques and to facilitate the accomplishment of the primary objective of the Association.
- Organize and promote meetings, seminars and conferences in order to maintain a well-informed industry.
- Organize, promote and make available apprenticeship and other training programs.
- Communicate and cooperate with other groups and persons whose interests and concerns appear to coincide with members.

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
